A Log Cabin Getaway Amid the Tranquility of Swan Lake



The Kootenai, formerly a collection of modest log cabins in Bigfork, was developed in grand style in the early 1900s by Lewis Orvis Evans and Cornelius "Con" Kelly, known as the Copper Kings. Spending time here were such luminaries as Charles Lindbergh, Queen Wilhelmina of the Netherlands and Western artist Charles M. Russell, for whom a four-bedroom, 4.5-bath cabin was named. From

1906 to 1920, Russell Cabin, which grew from 3,000 square feet in the late 1800s to 6,309 square feet today, functioned as the main lodge. Recently renovated and updated with security and lighting systems, it has rolling lakeside lawns and pristine views of the Rocky Mountains. The living room has a vaulted beam ceiling and a large stone fireplace. The residence is being sold furnished. \$6.5 million. Call 406-837-3000.
